Once you have completed your application form, please save the document as a PDF and submit it to the website. You may also submit up to 8 photographs of your work which should be compiled into a .zip file. This .zip file should be under 2MB in size.

You will receive an email confirming your application has been received.

Application process

The deadline for completed applications is 15 February 2016 at 5pm GMT. Any applications received after this time will not be considered.

All applications will be considered by a judging panel. We are delighted to have Shonagh Manson of Jerwood Charitable Foundation, representing one of the project funders participating in this panel alongside Hannah Bird, Producer and Renata Tyszczyk, Project Leader. Representatives from the artistic community will also be on our panel and announced in due course.

The decisions of the judging panel will be announced in a press release and on social media (@cultureandcc) as well on the website at the end of April 2016. The expected high number of entries, means we regret that we will only be able to notify the applicants that have been unsuccessful and not enter into any other correspondence.

The decisions of the judging panel are final.

How will this application be judged?

Our brief is about experimentation and collaboration – applications will be judged on the degree to which applicants engage with the brief to do innovative cultural work with climate change scenarios, and explore the potential for ‘networked residencies’.
